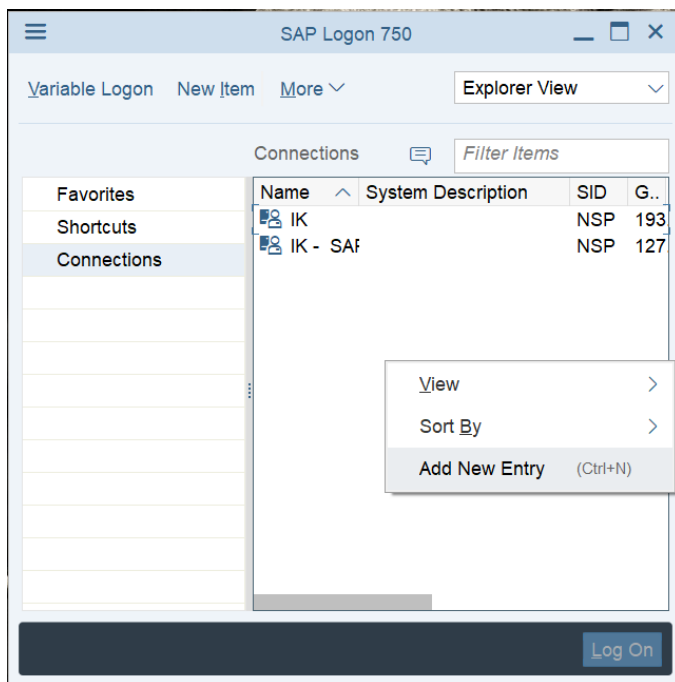
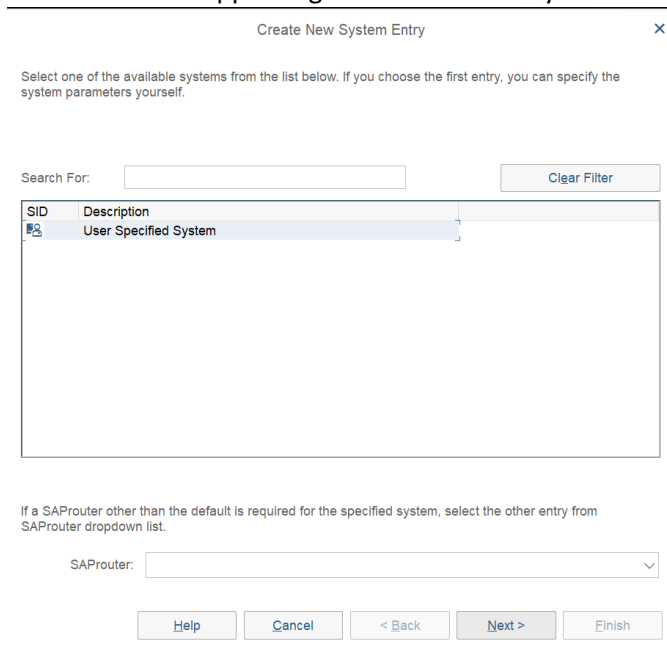


## How to enter into SAP system at home


1. Download the SAP GUI from this link:  
[https://arato.inf.unideb.hu/racz.anett/SAP/SAP\\_GUI.exe](https://arato.inf.unideb.hu/racz.anett/SAP/SAP_GUI.exe)
2. After installation we should add a new connection to our system. Right click in the right side of the window , under Connections, and choose Add New Entry from the pop up menu.



Click next into the appearing screen without any modification.




Enter the following information on next screen:

(You can not enter into the system yet!!!)

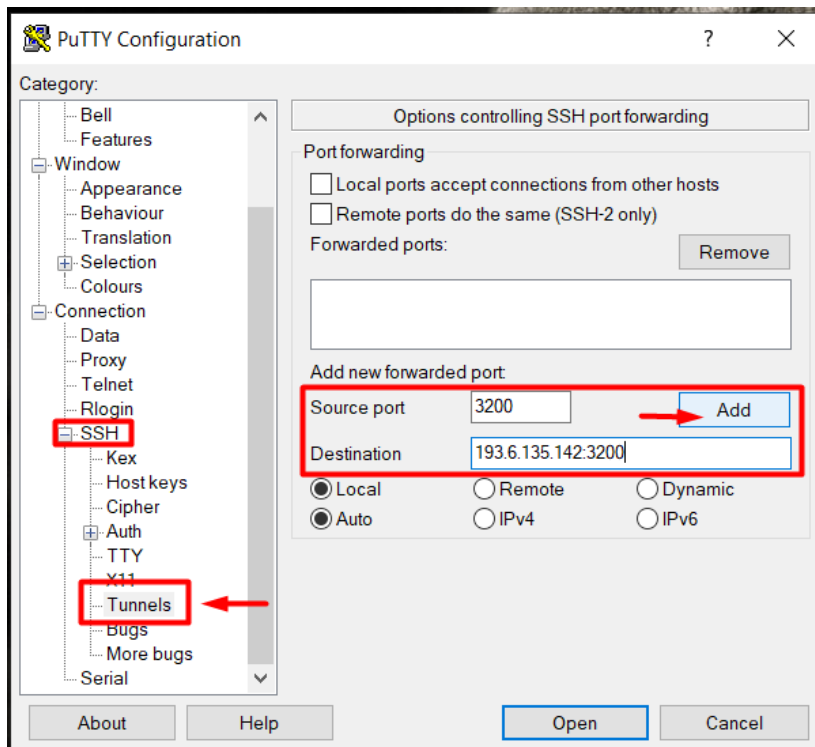
3. Download PuTTY from the following site:  
<https://www.chiark.greenend.org.uk/~sgtatham/putty/latest.html>  
Install it.
4. After installation start PuTTY and enter the following information.  
*shrek.unideb.hu*  
*2222*

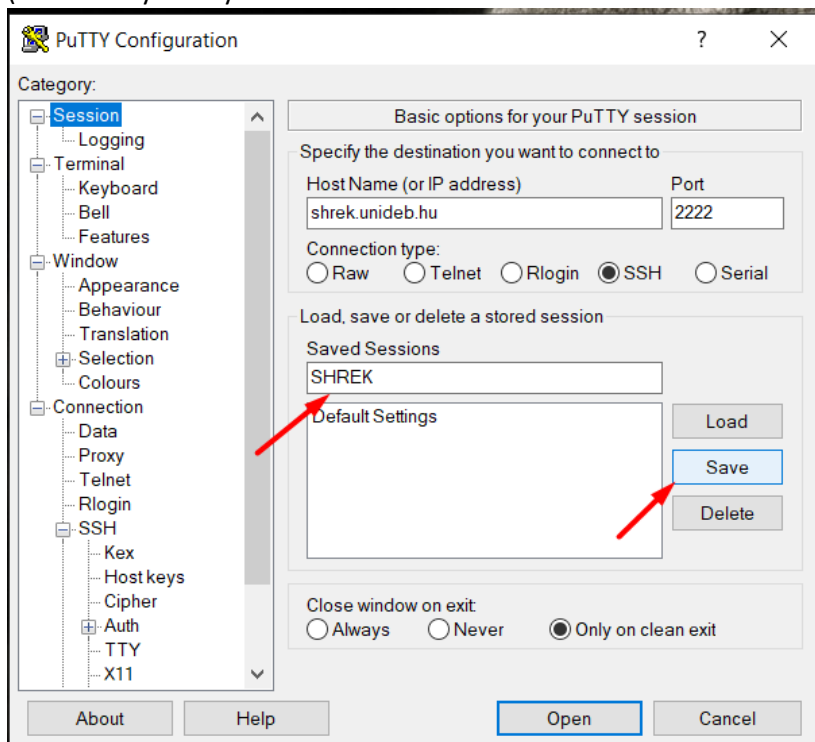


Click on Add button.

Let's save this session so we won't have to enter this information before each login.

In the left menu, choose Session (so go back to the first screen). Enter a name e.g. SHREK, then click on save button.

(Next time you only have to select the saved session and click on Load button)

6. In th popup command window enter your neptun (LDAP) username an then the password



7. After succesfully logon keep this window open in thebackground till you are working.
8. Go back to the SAP Logon and log on to the SAP system as usual.
