Dear Students,

A few reminders and some more information about exams, exam courses, and selection of thesis topics.

The main official educational system is still the Neptun, which should be used in the same way as before (announcing exams, recording results).

Exams must be announced in Neptun, students must sign in there. The deadline for the announcements of the exams are 10 April for graduates and 24 April for non-graduate students. The primary platform for distance learning is Moodle, through which the exams are also managed, but the grade (signature) is not recorded in Moodle, it will only be visible in Neptun.

The final exams will be held at the original dates (June 8 - 12, 2020) fixed in the schedule of the 2019/20 academic year. The method of holding the final exams is either conventional (personal) with maximum assurance of epidemiological regulations or online. Further details on final exams will be given soon -- the members of the final exams' committees and the graduating students will be informed in time.

The same applies to a parallel exam course as to the currently ongoing courses. In the case of exams, it is the lecturer's competence to allow e.g. working during semester (for an offered grade) for exam course students, or whether other methods of administration are used during the exam period (essentially the same procedure seems to be followed except for specific exceptions).

Non-parallel exam courses will soon be available in the Moodle system where relevant (there are registered students); I kindly ask the lecturers to pay attention to this. Students must be enrolled by lecturers in Moodle. For these courses, the content of the original syllabus can be fully followed, the methodology of the exam and the online meetings administrated only in Moodle.

The procedure for selecting and modifying the topic of the thesis/diploma thesis will also change.

The student agrees with the thesis supervisor in electronic form on the chosen topic and the work plan is prepared. If the lecturer accepts the student's application, he/she confirms it to the student via e-mail and sends a copy to to@inf.unideb.hu. The application form will be replaced by a Neptun application, to which the student will attach the work plan.

The application deadline will be changed to Friday, May 29, 2020.
